- Award-winning author Patrice Lawrence MBE visited the children in Years 5 and 6 to talk about her writing and her latest book, 'The Elemental Detectives'.
- Rev. Charlotte has visited school regularly to lead worship.
- On Friday 30<sup>th</sup> September, we held our Harvest Festival. Children in years 3 and 4 took part in the service, which due to very heavy rain, was moved from the church to school. The event went well and details of the charitable collection is listed in the section below.

- Key Stage 1 Performance this year's performance entitled 'The angel who nearly missed it all' took place on 5<sup>th</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup>, and 7<sup>th</sup> December. It was, once again, great to see a performance of such quality taking place.
- Carol service Year 6 led a traditional carol service at the church on Friday 9<sup>th</sup> December. As always, the reading and instrumental contributions were of a high standard and the singing (supported by Year 5) was fantastic.

## **Charity Fundraising**

- Our **Harvest Festival** supported a local debt relief charity called 'Shrewsbury Food Bank' and the children were asked to bring non-perishable produce. The quantity of produce brought to school was once again amazing.
- **Poppy Appeal** We raised £179 in support of this important national appeal.
- **PTA Events** In December we held our 'Christmas Market'. The event was a great success and raised a fantastic £2,121. The children designed Christmas cards again and this raised over £357. My thanks go to Mrs Gill and her team for all their hard work in organising these events that are enjoyed so much by the children. This term money raised by the PTA has been used to provide a generous subsidy of over £3,400 for the 'Beauty and the Beast' pantomime visit and also bought all the food for the children's Christmas parties at just over £350.
