# Newsletter - Summer Term 2022

## Introduction

As we reach the end of this term, I am absolutely delighted with all we have achieved during the last twelve weeks. The following section details our Year 6 SAT results that overall exceeded our previous best scores achieved in 2019 and did not dip, as results nationally did. A massive highlight of the term was the outstanding performance of our athletics team that won the Shrewsbury Area Sports competition. We were also delighted to see our Year 5 football team win the Shrewsbury and District U10 Boys Phil Lewis Cup.

Our fantastic arts week, with the theme of 'The Queen's Platinum Jubilee', was extremely well received by children and parents. It included an event where we reflected on the oak tree planted in 1977 for the Silver Jubilee and planted another oak tree to mark the Platinum Jubilee. It has also been great to see the return of sports days, induction for new Reception children and leavers assemblies. I hope this newsletter gives you a flavour of school life this term.



















## Year 6 Results

We were delighted with the performance of our Year 6 children in the national assessments. Nationally, most results fell by around 5%, presumably as a result of the pandemic and lock downs. At Oxon we did not see this drop and our results overall were higher than in 2019. The headline accountability measure of children achieving 'expected standard+' in reading, writing and maths is the highest we have ever achieved, surpassing our previous best in 2019. We are absolutely delighted with these outcomes which reflect very well on our remote learning provision during lockdown, our keyworker provision, our 'catch up' provision and the high quality of teaching and learning taking place throughout the school year.
